About the conference

Plant diseases remain a major challenge to agricultural productivity, food security and environmental sustainability. Climate change, the emergence of new pathogens, evolution of virulent races and increasing global trade have made plant disease management more challenging than ever before. At the same time, advances in genomics, molecular biology, artificial intelligence, remote sensing, nanotechnology and biological sciences are transforming the way plant diseases are detected, monitored and managed.

About the Indian Phytopathological Society (IPS)

About ICAR-NRCB (www.nrcb.org.in)

ICAR-NRCB, Tiruchirappalli, located in the heart of Tamil Nadu adjacent to the banks of river Cauvery. The centre was established on 21st August 1993 by ICAR, New Delhi with an aim to increase the production and productivity of banana and plantains through mission mode basic and strategic research approaches. The centre experiences warm and humid weather with the average minimum and maximum temperatures of 25°C and 35°C, respectively. The Office-cum-Laboratory building is located on Thogamalai road at Thayanur. The farm has a total area of 38 ha at Podavur village which is 1.5 km from the office cum laboratory building and is located in the New Kattalai Command area of the river Cauvery. The Centre works on four major thrust areas of research viz., Crop Improvement, Crop Protection, Crop Production and Post-Harvest Management. It has well-equipped research laboratories for Molecular Plant Pathology, Virus Diagnostics, Biocontrol, Tissue-Culture, Biotechnology, Soil Science, Physiology, Biochemistry, Entomology, Nematology, and Post-Harvest Technology. ICAR-NRCB has state-of-the-art facilities such as Bioreactor, GCMS, HPLC, ICP-OES, etc. Other infrastructure facilities such Common Incubation Centre, library, meeting and exhibition halls, green houses, quarantine lab and net houses are also available. The Mission of the Centre is to become the global leader in banana production, productivity and export. The vision of the centre is to increase the production and productivity of quality bananas through technological interventions.





About Tiruchirappalli

Tiruchirappalli, popularly known as Trichy, lies on the plains between the Shevaroy Hills to the north and the Palani Hills to the south and south-west. The two major rivers flowing in Tiruchirappalli are the Kaveri and its tributary the Kollidam. Tiruchirappalli has been recognised in India as an important educational centre since the time of British rule and it has reputed IIM and NIT. It is a city that beautifully blends history, spirituality, and natural charm. The most iconic landmark is the Rockfort Temple, perched atop a massive ancient rock, offering panoramic views of the city and housing cave temples of great archaeological value. Just across the Cauvery River lies the Sri Ranganathaswamy Temple at Srirangam, one of the largest functioning Hindu temples in the world, renowned for its architectural grandeur and spiritual significance. The Jambukeswarar Temple at Thiruvanaikaval, dedicated to Lord Shiva, is unique for its association with the element of water, while the Samayapuram Mariamman Temple draws thousands of devotees seeking blessings from the goddess. Beyond temples, Trichy showcases engineering marvels like the Kallanai (Grand Anaicut), a dam built by the Cholas in the 2nd century that still regulates the Cauvery's waters, and Mukkombe, a scenic spot where the river splits. Nature lovers can enjoy the Butterfly Park in Srirangam, one of Asia's largest, or explore the Pachamalai Hills with their lush greenery and tribal culture and it has the wonderful birds park. The city also has colonial-era churches such as St. Lourde's Church and St. Mary's Cathedral, adding to its diverse heritage.

Venue

The IPS National Conference will be organized in the Breeze Residency (3/14, McDonalds Rd, near Central Bus Stand, Melapudur, Cantonment, Tiruchirappalli, Tamil Nadu 620001; Phone: 097900 32444). The hotel is positioned in a prime location and has a reputation of hosting many international and national conferences with its modern facilities.

How to reach Venue?

The conference venue Breeze residency is conveniently located in the city centre. It is approximately 8 kms from the airport and Panjapur Integrated Bus Terminus, 1 km from the Railway station and Central Bus stand. Best presentation awards will be given for each technical session which is to be decided by a panel of distinguished jury members.

APS Travel Sponsorship for Ph.D. Students

APS Travel Sponsorship for Students has been instituted by the IPS. The purpose of this award is to encourage plant pathology students pursuing a doctoral degree in India, who are members of IPS, to attend the American Phytopathological Society (APS) Annual Meeting or other APS approved meetings, if deemed appropriate by the IPS and APS Foundation Board. The award has been established with contributions from Plant Pathologists of Indian Origin. Students will compete at the zonal and national level competitions in India and the awardee will be selected from the top-ranking student presenters at the national level competitions.

The terms and conditions for participating in APS meeting are as follows:

- The fund will be reimbursed to the awardee directly by APS for return airfare from India to the meeting venue, accommodation and incidentals.
- The awardee is expected to bear the cost of meeting registration.
- There will be no financial liability to the IPS.
- All the contestants/recipients should be the member of the Society during the year of presentation.
- The contestants will have to submit a brief biodata, certificate furnishing the age and proof of pursuing Ph.D. (First to Third year only) along with a short note (not exceeding one page) stating how participation in the APS meeting will help in achievement of their professional goals.
- The award will be given to the best paper presented in the Annual Meeting of APS.





- The awards will be judged by a committee appointed for the purpose and their decision will be final.
- The award will be given only to the Ph.D. Student presenting the paper.
- The time allocated for presentation of paper is 15 minutes.
- In-service candidates are not eligible for this APS travel award.

Prof. M.J. Narasimhan Merit Academic Award

Zonal Chapter should organize a contest among the zonal members during the Zonal Chapter's Meeting for preliminary selection of contestants. Only two names from each Zonal Chapter will be recommended by Zonal President for final contest to be held during Annual Meeting of the Society. The age limit for the contestant would be 35 years. Selected contestant will provide an abstract upto 250 words along with brief biodata to the Secretary, Indian Phytopathological Society through Zonal President on or before November 30, 2026. The Society will award a medal to award recipient and Commendation Certificate to other contestants. Society will publish the paper of awardee. The award recipient must submit full-length paper (as per IPS guidelines) for its publication in the journal Indian Phytopathology. There is no restriction of the age of co- author, if any. Prof. M.J. Narasimhan Merit Academic Award contest shall be organized during Annual Meeting of the Society.
